Dating in Later Life

As we age many of us have lost our partners and given time, we may be feeling that dipping our toes into the dating pool would be something we are interested in. Gone are the days when we would meet people at school dances etc. The dating game has changed, and it can be very challenging and confusing knowing where to start. Even the idea of starting to search for someone to spend time with can be confusing and anxiety producing. It's important to know that you are not alone in these feelings. While it will take some courage to seek out a new partner it can result in the creation of a new and exciting time in your life. Online dating is so mainstream for many younger folks that they have no hesitation in utilizing this method of meeting folks. For those of us older folks online dating, which screens such issues as age, interests, and abilities can help us avoid the sometimes-awkward dates of the past. While the internet can be problematic there are several reputable sites available. Meeting with someone for the first time at a social function where there are other folks can add an element of comfort and safety that you might want to consider.

Deferring Property Taxes

Tax season is once again upon us, and I wanted to remind folks of the option of deferring your home taxes. Homeowners who are 55 or older, or a surviving spouse of someone 55 or over or a person with disabilities, can defer their municipal taxes in order to utilize that money in other areas of their life. The current interest rate is 3.45% and is in effect until September 30. The interest rates are determined on December 15th and June 15th of each year. It is important to note that this is simple interest not compounded interest which is another great feature of this program. You will be charged a \$60 administrative fee when you first apply for the referral and for every following year a renewal fee of \$10. The program requires that you maintain a minimum of 25% equity of the homes value. There is more information and an application form on the B.C. Driving safety tips

It never hurts to remind ourselves about some basic safety tips. Keep your vehicle locked at all times even when driving, use well-lit streets whenever possible, route plan ahead if you are travelling to an unfamiliar destination, have your keys in your hand as you approach your parked vehicle to reduce the amount of time to enter your care, and always look inside you car before entering to ensure that no one is in the back seat.
